While you are pregnant, especially in the later stages of pregnancy (8th-month of pregnancy to delivery), you are more vulnerable to developing severe illness with COVID-19 when infected.

The Safety and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccination during pregnancy

Outcomes of the COVID-19 vaccinations administered to pregnant people outside of Japan revealed two things:

- COVID-19 vaccine would help protect pregnant people and babies against COVID-19.
- Vaccinations reduce the risk of developing severe illness from COVID-19-related complications
