

What is a Community-Based Comprehensive Support Center?

It is a **comprehensive consultation center** that connects older adults and their caregivers with various types of support, helping them continue living in their familiar community in their own way.

Main Steps to Use Long-Term Care Insurance Services

Apply for long-term care certification
Apply at your local municipal office

Receive a home visit survey by municipal staff

The staff will assess the individual's physical and mental condition, as well as daily living activities.

* Make sure the individual or their family clearly explains their condition to the staff.

Notification of the certification result will be sent from the municipality:

Not eligible

Support level 1–2

Care level 1–5

Create a (preventive) care plan

※The individual or their family can also make the plan themselves.

For Support Level 1–2:

The Community Comprehensive Support Center creates a preventive care plan.

For Care Level 1–5:

A care manager creates the care plan.

You may be able to use "Preventive Care and Daily Life Support Services".

- **Home-based (in-home / day) services:**
Used while continuing to live at home.
- **Facility-based or residential services:**
Living in a location other than your home.
